# **Hydraulic Overload**

Problem	Consequence	Solutions
Too much water flowing into the system at once	Too much water can cause the system to go into high-level alarm	Wash only full loads of laundry or dishes. Spread laundry washing over several days. Don't connect water softeners or sump pumps to system. Fix leaky fixtures.

#### **Paints**

_	Problem	Consequence	Solutions
	<ul><li>Paints</li><li>Solvents</li></ul>	Kills living bacteria, covers and clogs pipes and bed.	Don't pour paint or solvents down the drain. Don't wash paint brushes in household sinks.

Problem	Consequence	Solutions
<ul> <li>Heavy obje of system</li> <li>Impermeat cover</li> <li>Re-grading</li> </ul>	components or compact the soil.  Prevents necessary	Don't drive vehicles heavier than a riding lawn mower over the system. Do not place any structures on it. Don't cover the bed with concrete or asphalt. Don't regrade the property without consulting the installer.
